**Subject:-** Grant of conditional permission to Dr. B.N.M Rural Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Smt. Sushiladevi, Nagur Colony College Road, Tq. & Distt. Bijapur-586101, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0055) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 20 Seats ( instead of 21 seats) in 05 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma -03 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 07 Seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-02 seats (instead of 03 seats) (v) Swasthavritta- 03 seats for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

- With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.
- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Dr. B.N.M Rural Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Smt. Sushiladevi, Nagur Colony College Road, Tq. & Distt. Bijapur-586101, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0055), inspection of your College was conducted on 01.02.2024 & 02.02.2024 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 21 Seats in 05 PG Course in the subject namely i) Kayachikitsa-05 seats ii) Panchakarma -03 seats iii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 07 Seats iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-03 seats v) Swasthavritta- 03 seats, for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

#### Shortcoming as per Visitation

1. Animal House is not available.
2. Three faculties were found on unauthorized absence on the day of visitation and no leave application has been found. The details of faculties are as below:-
  - a) Kavitha chavan (AYPK01285) - Assistant Professor/Lecturer in the department of Panchakarma.
  - b) Kavita Basavaraj Gudadinni (AYDG01274) – Professor in the department of Dravyaguna Vigyana.
  - c) Archana chougule (AYDG01010) - Professor in the department of Dravyaguna Vigyana.
4. In view of above, assessment report was placed in the 86<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 19.04.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report, Board discussed and decided to seek clarification from your college regarding the same.
5. Further, in response to Board's letter of even number dated 25.04.2024, your college has submitted the clarification vide ref no. Dr.BNM/AMC/clarification/2024-25/52 dated 26.04.2024 regarding non availability of animal house and for unauthorized

absence of three faculties on the day of visitation along with a request to reduce the number of seats in the department of Dravyaguna Vigyan as there is a deficiency of teaching faculty in the aforementioned department in your college for the academic year 2024-25.

**Shortcoming observed after clarification:**

**a) Teaching staff for PG :-**

b) Dept. Signage / Signages of OPD need to be installed properly.

6. Thereafter, the assessment report was placed in the **89<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **10.05.2024**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even number** dated **28.05.2024** to appear on **30.05.2024** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 21 Seats in 05 PG Course in the subject namely i) Kayachikitsa-05 seats ii) Panchakarma -03 seats iii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 07 Seats iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-03 seats v) Swasthavritta- 03 seats, for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied**. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. Dr.BNM/AMC/NCISM/Hearing/2024-25/110 dated 29-05-2024** against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
7. Whereas, the college through its representative, **Dr. Prasad. V, Principal** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **30.05.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda Medical College and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

8. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2022 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)**, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was

placed in the **92<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **31.05.2024**.

9. In view of the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the Board observed that the college is **fulfilling the criteria for issuance of Conditional permission for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 18 seats in 04 PG courses namely i) Kayachikitsa-05 seats ii) Panchakarma -03 seats iii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 07 Seats iv) Swasthavritta- 03 seats and not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of Conditional permission in the department for Dravyaguna Vigyana-03 seats due to non fulfilment of teacher-student ratio for the number of PG seats in the department. However, the Board decided to issue Conditional Permission** as per regulation 16, (1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016.

10. Further, as per regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016, The teacher student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor. The teacher student ratio shall be 1: 1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience. a. "In case of non availability of Professor in the Post graduate department or specialty, permission shall be granted as per the available teacher student ratio by reducing the intake strength in the concerned department."

As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the **92<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, the college is not fulfilling the required teacher student ratio in the department of Dravyaguna vigyan for PG. The teacher availability is -0 Professor, 01 Associate Professor and 01 Assistant Professor without having minimum of five years teaching experience are available. Hence, fulfilling for 02 seats instead of 03 seats.**

11. Hence, as per regulation 16, (1) & (2) of Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016, the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 20 Seats (instead of 21 seats) in 05 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma -03 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 07 Seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-02 seats (instead of 03 seats) & (v) Swasthavritta- 03 seats** for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

12. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Conditional Permission is issued to Dr. B.N.M Rural Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Smt. Sushiladevi, Nagur Colony College Road, Tq. & Distt. Bijapur-586101, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0055) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 20 Seats (instead of 21 seats) in 05 PG course in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma -03 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 07 Seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-02 seats (instead of 03 seats) & (v) Swasthavritta- 03 seats for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**

(i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.

(ii) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 60 seats UG and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 20 seats (instead of 21 seats) in 05 PG courses** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

(iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

13. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

14. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

15. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

16. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:**

(i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.

- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016;
- iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- v) Shortcoming mentioned in Point no. 10.

17. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
